Team Taranaki's mission to win promotion into Capital Football's Central League competition has just got harder.

Energyworks Taranaki went down 2-0 to Wellington United in the first of a home and away two-game series at the Merrilands Domain in New Plymouth on Sunday.

It is the first time Taranaki has been kept scoreless and their first loss this season.

The promotion-relegation series now moves to Petone in Lower Hutt where the two teams meet again on Saturday to play the series decider.

The scenario now facing Taranaki is that it needs to not only win the Petone encounter, but recover two goals and can't afford to concede any.

Not an easy assignment against a side that won this season's premier league in the capital city.

But Taranaki coach Ian McGrath isn't about to raise the white flag just yet.

"I said to the boys, it's half-time in a game of football. I've been 2-0 down in a game of football at halftime before and still won a game, so that's the way we look at it. McGrath said.

"Of course today's loss is disappointing and the way they (Wellington United) scored their goals leaves you a little bit downhearted," he said.

Both goals came from the boot of Jame McGarry, who proved elusive and difficult to shut down.

"It didn't look like a foul to me and the guy has slotted it," McGrath said.

Taranaki created plenty of good chances with wing Brad Hickling going close to scoring on at least four occasions, while midfielder Nathan Hill hit the post twice.

The homeside were also guilty of not sustaining pressure on the opposition in the attacking third when they appeared rattled.

Overall, the youthful United side looked a talented lot and being from Wellington were not troubled when playing into a strong wind in the second half.
